LB 117, 268, 289, 691

Mr. President, Senator Hannibal would move to place LB 289 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. That will be laid over.

And, Mr. President, Senator Vard Johnson would like to expedite LB 268. (See pages 1163-64 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: No objection? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on 691 is by Senator Vickers. Senator Vickers would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over unless the introducer agrees to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers on your motion. Senator DeCamp wants to...

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, let me ask Senator Vickers or Senator Beutler or both on the kill motion. The question has been raised as to whether this is constitutional with my amendment. Do you want to wait until such time as when we get an Attorney General's Opinion, assuming that they will give us an objective opinion?

SENATOR VICKERS: Certainly, Senator DeCamp, I'll wait.

SENATOR DECAMP: That's okay by me.

PRESIDENT: Then you're asking that further discussion be laid over?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yeah.

PRESIDENT: Is there objection? If not, so ordered. Further discussion on 691 will lay in for the future. Next I guess we go to LB 117.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 117 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Haberman. (Title read.) The bill was first read on January 11 of this year. It was referred to the Public Health Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Public Health and Welfare Committee amendments, Mr. President.
