PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR VICKERS: But we've got to keep it up here for one of those priorities, it seems to me. Senator Higgins made, I think, the best point of all. If we are going to really be serious about talking about economic development in this state, if we are really going to be serious about trying to expand our base of economics so that we aren't so reliant on agriculture, economic development, I would suggest to you, begins in the classroom. I don't think General Motors or anybody else is too darned interested in coming to Nebraska if they are not going to have the people to go to work for them after they get here. We can create all kinds of great tax mechanisms to encourage them to come in here, spend a lot more than \$3 million and we are still not going to get them in here if we don't have the folks trained to help them. That is what LB 415 is all about. I urge the advancement of the bill. I will urge the advancement of the A bill, and then I will suggest we hold the A bill over there and wait and see what happens in this priority setting process as we get down to the end of the session. Thank you, Mr. President.
