SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if I could have your attention just a moment, please. I'm not inferring that we are quitting for the morning, but just so you'll know what we are doing the rest of the week and next week. Tomorrow, of course, is Tuesday, isn't it? We have Final Reading for a little bit, and then back to General File. Wednesday, you know, we have consent calendar. So I would assume you will want to be on time so you can squeeze as many out that day as you can. Thursday, of course, hearings are through by that time and we go into full days starting Thursday. We start with priority bills Thursday. Friday, full day, more priority bills. Then skipping to the next week, you know we are off Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday over the Easter weekend. But on Thursday, April 4, which is the day before we take off, I think we'll go to about twelve-thirty, one o'clock, and knock it off for the day because most of us will be sneaking away anyway that afternoon, so we just as well quit about twelve-thirty, one o'clock and call it a day; then, of course, back Tuesday, April 9. So, just thought I'd give you a little word ahead as to how we plan this. Thank you.
