PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb. Senator Hefner is next.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, I would ask...Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house. I have got some remarks I would like to have people hear and they just are not here.

PRESIDENT: We are not in order, that's for certain. A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails and the house is under call. All members of the Legislature be notified that the house is under call and you are requested to return to the Chamber if you are outside the legislative Chamber. Two members of the Legislature are excused at the present time. We are looking for 47 members. All members are properly to be in their seats during the time the house is under call. Unauthorized personnel are not to be on the floor during the time the house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Senator Abboud, Senator Barrett, Senator Beutler, Senator Eret, Senator Chronister, Senator Schmit. The house is under call. All members of the Legislature are requested to return to the Chamber and record your presence and you are properly to be in your seats during the time the house is under call, not roaming around.
