

PRESIDENT: Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I wholeheartedly endorse the resolution. It really shows what a nonpartisan body we are with Senator Hartnett introducing this resolution, so I would urge your support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Anyone else wish to speak on LR 78? If not, the motion is to adopt LR 78 in honor of the late Charles Reed. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the adoption of LR 78. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 78, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LR 78 is adopted. Senator Wesely asked for the floor.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to suspend Rule 4, Section 6 so as to permit consideration of LR 79 today.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely. May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I apologize for bringing this up at the last second, but tonight there is a banquet honoring the Nebraska Wesleyan basketball team for finishing third in the N.C.A.A. Division II (sic.) basketball championships. As a result the thought is that if we could pass this resolution today and I'd ask all of you if you'd wish, once we get an official copy of it, if you'd like to sign it. We would present the resolution tonight at the banquet. So I'm asking to suspend the rules, consider the resolution and adopt it today so we have it passed today in order to present tonight at the banquet.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson.
