LB 153, 346

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nays on the motion to advance LB 346, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The bill is advanced. Now we move to consent calendar bills that do have committee amendments. LB 153.

CLERK: Mr. President, 153 was offered by Senator Vard Johnson. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 14, referred to Public Works, advanced to General File. There are Public Works Committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, Senator Johnson is absent, would you handle the committee amendments. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the committee amendments provide that the reinstatements for Nonresident Violator Compact suspensions, implied consent revocations, and the moving traffic violation reinstatements that are required in LB 153, would be subject to a reinstatement fee. It also provides that we reduce the fee from \$50 to \$25. The Department of Motor Vehicles indicated that, with the additional reinstatements that would be required with LB 153, they do not need as much money for the reinstatements to break even. Therefore, the committee decided to reduce the fee. Any questions, I'll be glad to answer them, if not I move the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments that Senator Schmit has explained? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the adoption of committee amendments to LB 153. Please record your vote. Please record your vote on the committee amendments to LB 153. May we have your cooperation. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments to LB 153.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted. Now back to the bill. Senator Beyer.
