

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure. But here is what I'm trying to find out, you are saying that no matter how a person makes a check, after a person has made ten of them with or without direct supervision, then there is \$1.00 charged for every check after that? Are there two categories of checkings?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes. Let me explain.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is what I want clarified.

SENATOR DECAMP: At the present time if you check by telephone, if you check by mail, there is a \$2.00 charge for each check. For example, I call in, they have to put somebody specifically on the phone and do the check, report back to me by telephone, there is a \$2.00 charge for each one. However, if I, personally, walk over there right now there is no charge. And there are some individuals, the Secretary of State claims, that are doing this as a business so to speak and basically are using the taxpayer to finance their business. They go and they get all the records, and then they turn around and utilize the records...or sell them to other people. For personal use, above...we figured up to about ten, it makes sense that the individual should be able to do that, at least ten on a daily basis, which is a rather large amount, quite frankly, if they physically go in. Above ten we decided a \$2.00 charge seems to be a reasonable thing...\$1.00.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I agree, but I was wondering why ten were allowed because it does seem like a person doing that, on a daily basis, would probably have something more than just a personal interest in the individuals being checked. But ten was decided as the reasonable number?

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, ten was settled on. The Secretary of State would have preferred, I think, zero. Some of the other industry...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Interrupting) I won't hold the bill now.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...would have preferred another number, zero also. They would have said their should be no limit. Ten was the figure settled on. Whether it should be 5, or 3, or 17, I don't know.
