

and said, yes, you should, as a citizen, be able to walk into the courthouse and not be charged unreasonable or exorbitant amounts or maybe any amount for routine citizen inquiries. So this bill clears up that situation for all courthouses and, as I say, makes it also clear, with respect to the Secretary of State's office, where our central indexing system is that if citizens use that system, which they will be in the future, that when they inquire more than ten in any one day then a charge would come into effect.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance LB 108. All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance LB 108, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The bill is advanced. LB 700.

CLERK: Mr. President, 700 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Pappas. (Read title.) It was first read on January 22, referred to Banking, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, Chairman.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes. Senator Pappas...this is a good bill and Senator Pappas will explain the amendments which become the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Pappas on the committee amendments.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. President and colleagues, the committee amendments basically clarify the language of who will be eligible, how long a time, and everything else to continue a lease or a franchise from an oil company upon death of the original holder. I move to advance the committee amendments.
