CLERK: No, sir, nothing.

PRESIDENT: We are ready then to go into the General File to the beginning of priority bills. LB 288.

CLERK: Mr. President, 288 was a bill that was introduced by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee and signed by its members as well as a number of the other members. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 17 of this year, referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. It was considered on February 15 at which time the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee amendments were adopted. There was a motion then made by Senator Chambers to indefinitely postpone the bill. That laid it over.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner to explain the bill and may we have order in the Chamber and keep your conversational level down, please. Order in the Chamber so we may hear the speaker. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I will try and explain the bill...

PRESIDENT: Senator...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone not on)...it until I speak with the Clerk for a second because my motion...

PRESIDENT: We understand that. We understand. We thought we would let Senator Hefner explain the bill and then go directly to your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Senator Hefner, what is your intent in speaking now?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Chambers, I don't believe that the bill has ever been explained. We adopted the committee amendments and then your kill motion came up and we...I believe we adjourned then for the day.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So all you want then is an opportunity to explain the bill?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, I think this body has a right to know
