

taxpayer, to replace those books because someone else thinks they should have the opportunity to take those books and keep them, if they so please. I support this amendment and I support the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the adoption of the Lundy amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You are voting in the adoption of the Lundy amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Lundy's amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Lundy amendment is adopted. What else do you have, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Vickers. (Read Vickers amendment as found on page 1240 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, as I indicated a little bit ago, I know all of us have been contacted by our librarians back home. I know it is difficult to say that you are going to vote against your librarians bill. It is so difficult, as a matter of fact, that it's clear to me that this bill is going to pass, even though I think it is the wrong thing to do, even though I think we're creating special legislation that we should not be creating. I would like for you to open your bill books to page 2 and 3, and read Section 3. Tell me if you really think that makes sense. Do you really think it makes sense to say that a librarian, or its agent or employee can arrest somebody and then not be held...can cause the detention or arrest of a person and then not be held civil liab...any civil liability for any unlawful detention, any slander, any malicious prosecution, any false imprisonment, any false arrest, or assault and battery of the person so arrested, unless excessive or unreasonable force is used. I don't know what kind of assault and battery is not excessive or unreasonable. Whether or not it takes arrest, whether or not such arrest takes place on the library premises, in other words what we are saying...now I recognize this is rather ridiculous because there are probably not that many librarians out there that are capable of doing it, but what
