

amendment is adopted, the only time you would be able to be given a ticket or even stopped would have to be if some other offense was involved like you were stopped for speeding and they found out you didn't have a seat belt on or you were arrested for drunken driving and you weren't wearing your seat belt. So that is an important provision and it is in the amendments and it does, in my opinion, at least make the bill palatable if it got to that point.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as Senator Morehead knows I am opposed to the bill but, Senator Morehead, I have five amendments and the first one reads as follows and I'm wondering if you would object to this amendment that I have so would you please listen to it and see if you would object to it instead of your section. One, it says, "Enforcement of this act by any state or local law enforcement agencies shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when a driver of a passenger automobile has been detained for suspected violation of some other offense." I believe that this is more specific and clear than the way you have it in the bill so would you object when this amendment comes up to putting this amendment on the bill?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Senator Haberman, I guess that I feel that our bill says the very same thing as your amendment and I guess because of that I like my wording better.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, Senator Morehead, I will try to put my amendment on because it's more specific and to the point and clearer and I don't want rules and regulations and people fussing with this bill if it should happen to, for some reason, pass. Thank you, Senator Morehead. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: A question of Senator DeCamp.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Will you respond, Senator DeCamp, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: I'm opposed. I'm the opposition.

SENATOR BEYER: I want to get your interpretation of that
