

SPEAKER NICHOL: There are several who have their lights on that wish to talk to the bill. Are there any I have not called on that wish to talk about the committee amendments? If not, the question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments as amended. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays...I'm sorry, 25 ayes, 6 nays on adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Now we're back to the bill. Senator Morehead, did you wish to talk first on that?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President and members of the body, I'd like to say...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me, Senator Morehead, I understand we have another amendment. Did you wish to explain your bill now the way it stands and then we'll take up the amendments? Yes, all right, please.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I'd like to say just a few things about the bill as it stands now and many people have been addressing not only the amendments, but the bill itself. It is so that it is only a secondary stop. You cannot stop a vehicle as Senator DeCamp was concerned about primarily for the infraction of noncompliance for the use of safety belts. It is a fine of \$25.00 and that is in compliance with the standards from the Department of Transportation. It does affect front seat passengers only and only in vehicles after 1965 and only where there are safety belts installed by the manufacturer. So in a case of, specifically pickup trucks which people are concerned about, if a pickup truck has three safety belts installed by the manufacturer and four passengers which is legal in the State of Nebraska as long as it does not impede the vision or the operation of the driver, then only three belts are to be worn. Unfortunately that fourth person is without protection. As I have indicated earlier there are exemptions, medical exemptions, rural mail carrier exemptions. If you had questions about before motorcycle exemptions, moped exemptions...did I mention physicians? Physicians exemptions I think I mentioned, I want to be sure. If I didn't, I want to be sure to mention that. Now on the mitigation section as we
