SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you wish to have that withdrawn, Senator Morehead? Excuse me, Senator Morehead, did you wish to withdraw that? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Miller. Senator Miller, I understand you wish to withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: So ordered.

CLERK: The next amendment I have, Mr. President, is by Senator Haberman. Senator, this is your first amendment. (Haberman amendment appears on page 1259 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, these amendments are all in bills passed by other states. Senator Morehead told me that my first amendment she would go along with and it states, "Enforcement of this act by state or local law enforcement agencies shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when a driver of a passenger automobile has been detained for a suspected violation or some other offense." And I believe Senator Morehead said she would go along with this amendment because it was explained simpler than the one that is in the bill now.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Morehead, does the amendment that you took a while ago take care of this? I'm just asking for my own edification.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, members of the body, I felt that it did take care of that. Senator Haberman feels that it should be more clearly stated. The intention of our amendment is to say what Senator Haberman is saying, but if he feels more comfortable with this particular amendment, I have no objection.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. Speaker, point of order. Is this amendment, or are Senator Haberman's amendments printed in the Journal?
