

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Mr. President, if I may, I think perhaps...that has not been passed out to us at this point in time. Is that right? As I understand Senator Haberman's amendment, it says that you cannot be stopped unless...or the law cannot be enforced unless it is secondary to some kind of other detention on the part of the law enforcement officer, which I take it to mean that if he stops you for some other potential violation and he happens to see you don't have your seat belt on, then he can enforce the law. Is that correct, Senator Haberman? Okay. Now what is in the bill right now the language reads no person shall be stopped, inspected or detained solely to determine compliance with Section 1 of this act and for the life of me I'm having a lot of problems trying to figure out what it is that your amendment adds to that language, Senator Haberman. And if by way of an example you could indicate a distinction, that would be very helpful to me because truly they look the same.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Beutler, all of these amendments were adopted directly from the New Jersey law. This is the way they wrote it and as far as I am concerned they wrote it and passed it and it is a lot clearer than the way we have it so that's where I got all of these amendments, is from the New Jersey law.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Haberman, until I can understand it better, it seems to me that your amendment does not delete Section 3.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, it will when I ask that Section 3 be deleted and this be inserted in there.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You're amending your amendment at this point in time then?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'm going to change Section 3 and put this in. I'll correct it now.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler, it's your time. Did you wish to speak further or...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'll...leave my button on, Mr. Speaker, and as soon as I can see the amendment I may choose to speak.
