CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Haberman amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman, your amendment would read as follows, now, Senator, if I might, it would strike Section 4 of the Morehead-Goll amendment and insert the following language, "Any person who violates this law shall, for the first offense, receive a warning stating the requirements of the law and the use of safety seat belt systems and the penalties for a second or subsequent violation."
