SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, let's try them and see what happens, if Shirley gets upset.

CLERK: All right. Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend Section 4 of the Morehead-Goll amendment. "For a second violation a person shall be fined \$5.00."

SENATOR HABERMAN: The only thing this does is it reduces the fine. It only costs them \$5.00, instead of what the bill says. Now if that is going to get people all upset, let me know because I'm really trying to help the people and trying to educate them. Five bucks is...you know, I think that is enough.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Shirley Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I think you see what is happening, members of the Legislature. I think you can tell this would take us out of compliance and put verbiage into the statutes which accomplishes nothing and that is exactly what Senator Haberman hopes will happen, that no one will have a charge. I do not feel that this is something that we want to put in statutes. I plan to vote against it. I'm looking at the next one, and that is a \$10 fine, and I'm looking at the next one. I hope, perhaps, Senator Haberman will withdraw the others since his first one, which was a helpful piece of equipment, was adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Morehead. Did you say you wish to withdraw that?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, rather than get everybody all angry and upset, I'll withdraw all the amendments that I have.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All the amendments that Senator Haberman has are withdrawn. Do you have anything else up there, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator, kill motion? Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone. that would lay it over unless the introducers would agree to take it up at this time.
