SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I guess I'll start on the school buses that Senator Haberman was talking about. We have laws in regard to school buses that require a high-back seat and padded seats because there are some problems with strapping kids into a school bus. There are no side doors. They are not going to fly out of the bus, like you do out of a car. You don't fly into the windshield, like you do in a car. They are protected in their seats. Now maybe they would be better protected if they had seat belts. I wouldn't argue that, but we are not leaving them unprotected because they do have padded, high seat backs so that if they do fly forward their face is going to hit a padded seat belt (sic) and not a windshield or some other parts of the car (sic). They are not going to fly out of the bus like they would out of a car. We've been talking a little bit about requiring people to do things. You know the other day we talked quite a long while about requiring people to do things. We say we don't require people to do things. We talked a long time about 662. You are going to require people to join with the Class II, III, IV, V, VI district. Why? Your argument was it is going to save you some money, I suppose. Your argument was they weren't paying their fair share. I do know that some of you are consistent here, but there are some of you that oppose 662 and are also opposing this one. But I don't think Senator Haberman was very consistent. He was willing to put
