I wish Senator Chambers was listening but I think these are two separate issues, but rather than add my name to his bill what I would recommend and offer is that we approach the Speaker when the two come up and have them heard side by side at the same time so the debate can be lively and consistent through both bills and so we can argue malaria and scarlet fever at the same time in two different numbers if we have to. Seriously, I do believe that the issues have been put before you. We would like to have the bill pulled from committee. It will take 30 votes to do so, as you understand. These are not priority bills, either one of them. They probably will not get to the floor this year although I hope that they do. I think the issue is important to discuss right now as to whether it should come out of committee and I would urge the adoption of my motion. Senator Chambers has asked if he could have 30 seconds of my time and I will give the rest of my closing time to him.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, people like Senator Hannibal create problems for me. He put the matter in a context where I have to vote with him, but I don't like the issue and I am going to do all I can to kill it if it gets out here. And if that doesn't look feasible, you may come up missing.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Have you concluded, Senator Hannibal? The question is, shall we place LB 289 on General File notwithstanding the committee's action? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 7 nays to raise LB 289, Mr. President.
