LB 94, 183, 487, 625, 662

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 625 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 94.

CLERK: (Read LB 94 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 1281-82 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill passes. LB 487.

CLERK: (Read LB 487 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please. We have a problem with our clutch. (Voting machine malfunction.)

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 1282-83 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 487 passes. May I please introduce some guests of Senator Hefner. In the north balcony there are eight students, sixth grade students from the First Trinity Lutheran School in Bloomfield, Nebraska. Would you please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you. Mr. Clerk, do you have something to put in the record?
