SENATOR HARTNETT: Who is going to vote on Ak-Sar-Ben, for Ak-Sar-Ben if it's a vote of the local...is that a...?

SENATOR DECAMP: That would be local option, the county I would guess. I don't know exactly what their situation is, city or county. I don't know whether Ak-Sar-Ben is in the county or the city. I get different stories.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So it would have to have the vote of the people of the county for Ak-Sar-Ben to have this?

SENATOR DECAMP: I'm sure it would be done by the elected officials there, but they would have to be approved either through whatever procedure they have. I'm going to guess it must be a vote of the local officials. It may be a vote of the people. I don't know, but I'm going to guess it's a vote of the local officials. Either way I am told. Either a vote of the people or the local officials.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Don't you think it should be the vote of the people of Douglas County?

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, of course, our local option laws are already in place and I think they have both methods, I'm told by Miscellaneous counsel. So they have both methods at the present time. We're not changing that at all. We're leaving that up to local option, the method.
