SENATOR LANDIS: Following the statement of the point.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR PIRSCH: We would appreciate it. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. And with that, ladies and gentlemen, I would ask each of you...excuse me, Senator Higgins, I would ask each of you and you have made your point, Senator Higgins, I would ask each of you when you ask for a point of personal privilege that you do make it a point of personal privilege, not an elongation of the conversation or the debate that has been happening after the closing. So with your indulgence and cooperation perhaps we can attain that goal. Thank you. Senator Johnson was closing and we are on the bill and we are about to vote on whether or not we advance the bill. So the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
