faith. We think it will help those of you who have some concerns to recognize that the committee will be fair. Senator Chambers can argue the point, but this is as best we can put in statutory language an attempt to be fair. I don't know what more you can do. If you want to give IQ tests or other efforts to try and make sure everybody is equal, you can get to a ridiculous level. But this is, I think, a fair attempt to try and be reasonable. We are asking your support for the amendment.

Voting on the Wesely amendment, that has been under discussion, to LB 407. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Do you have anything further on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely. Senator Higgins, I see your light.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. This dog will never die. I want to ask Senator Wesely a question.

PRESIDENT: May the Chair just intervene here to say that when and if we do get to the point of motion to advance, I have a request from two members for a machine vote. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you. Senator Wesely, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR WESELY: Certainly.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Under LB 407 you said that it would not prevent any senator from introducing a bill. So if, perhaps, next year Senator Morehead would introduce a bill for the inhalation therapists to be licensed and regulated, it is my understanding that the Clerk of the Legislature has
