SENATOR WESELY: It's not in the bill itself, Shirley. It's just that any time you have anything you can do that.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Senator Wesely. I still will vote red.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, I call the question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five hands? I do. Question is, shall the debate cease? There are other lights on. All those in favor of the debate ceasing vote aye, opposed vote nay. Motion is, shall the debate cease? Please record your vote, aye or nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.
