

be the thing to do. When that meeting was held, the interested parties who support this bill rejected out of hand apparently any amendments to the bill. As a matter of fact my information would indicate that "there is no compromising on this issue." I think it was a good faith effort on the part of this Legislature and a number of interested people to work out the compromise. There was no compromise. It would not be unreasonable then to conclude that the bill might very well have been advanced under false pretenses. I am concerned when a bill is moved from General to Select that quickly with the promise of a compromise and one simply isn't reached. I guess I am really not too eager to reward actions of that kind. Under those conditions I guess I would simply say I would reluctantly and very reluctantly support the kill motion. Thanks, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Ray Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I would call the question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting to cease debate. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator DeCamp, would you close, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, in my first years in the Legislature I used to love to put kill motions on bills and I found that that was not the way to make a lot of popularity. So in later years I only put a kill motion when I am really dead serious and believe that something should be killed, that nothing can be reached in terms of settlement. And then I try to only pick really kind of important matters. Believe it or not, 213 is one of the bigger bills of the session in terms of its impact upon a significant segment of Nebraskans. Sometimes it is the little things that have the really big impact here over the years. This is one of them, the definition of who is going to be a supervisor for this labor union negotiations. It is a big deal, has a lot of impact over a long period of time.
