LB 171, 171A

Senator Lynch, I think you had your light on. Okay, I have Senator Beutler. Did you wish to...I assume you may close on the bill, to advance the bill. Was there anyone else? Most of you turned your lights off when the amendment was taken. You seem to be the only one so if you wish to close, you may.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I don't really wish to close. I've burdened you longer than I should have already with the bill of this particular nature and I think everybody understands now what it is all about and I would simply encourage you to vote for the advancement of the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of LB 171. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance LB 171, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill advances. LB 171A.

CLERK: (Title read to LB 171A.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is the A bill that goes along with 171. It will be in the neighborhood of 90, \$95,000. It pays the judge's salary, a court reporter's salary and some additional help. It's fairly typical. A bill for the addition of one additional judge and I move the advancement of the A bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance the A bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The A bill is advanced. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not.
