

can stand on the floor and say that it can't work if we do it for all these other programs when he, as the President of the Pork Producers Association and an ex-pork producer himself, has been involved with an organization that was totally that way. I guess he thought that worked good, he must have. It is strange the decisions and the positions we take. I want to point out one other thing. For those people that are concerned about how they may have been lobbied by some folks, and, yes, I was lobbied by some folks too. I was lobbied by some of my constituents from the Livestock Feeders Association. It seems strange to me that those people and also the stock growers folks are telling me, as a livestock producer, that we ought to have LB 60 in the form that it is right now, and not make it refundable. But I can tell you if we get LB 60 in the form it is now, and not make it refundable, I don't see any need for those other organizations. I don't know why in the world anybody would belong to either the stock growers or the livestock feeders. Their purpose is to affect legislation, I thought, unless you want to use it for just a social club. I don't need to spend that kind of money for that kind of group for just a social club. What we ought to do is those folks had ought to say you know, hey, we really do want to have a large amount of money to help influence legislation. If they would have supported me and make it so it is refundable, then I think everybody would have been much better off. But as it is, I think this is going to be the death now for both of those industries, both of those organizations if we continue with the bill this way because they are going to have a tremendous amount of money in this organization, in a checkoff, a lot more than they've got in any of those others, and people are going to be spending money for it and they know they are going to be spending money for it. I don't think they are going to be voluntarily joining those other organizations. I think they are making a terrible mistake. Thank you, Mr. President.
