LB 493, 503

PRESIDENT: Now we have to go through the formality of adopting...advancing the bill, which is the...and I recognize Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This bill, as amended, provides that those who provide seed for the production of crops, or electric power for the production of crops shall be entitled to file, with the county clerk where the crop is grown, a lien on the crop being grown to secure payment for credit advance. The lien must be filed within 60 days of the providing of service. The notice of lien is to provide the following information: name and address of the claimant, name of the person receiving the product, contract price, the type and amount of the seed or power supplied, and the date provided, social security or federal identification number of the debtor, legal description of the land upon which the crop is to be grown. The lien, when filed, does not have priority over other prior filed items, current statutory liens provided to agriculture products or service providers for fertilizer, petroleum products, threshers and veterinary services and livestock. I move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on LB 503? Motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion before you is to adopt LB...to advance LB 503 that has been under discussion. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the motion to advance LB 503, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 503 is advanced. I understand that LB 404, that Senators Conway and Pappas are both excused?

CLERK: Yes, sir, that is correct.

PRESIDENT: We will move on then to 112, Withem and Hartnett.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman has a motion pending on 112, and Senator Haberman has been excused.

PRESIDENT: Very well, that eliminated that. We move then to LB 493.
