

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, I would like to withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: So ordered. Anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Conway.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Conway, please.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, as we have deliberated over LB 213 for quite some time and at some distance as I have been from this particular process and noticing what seemed to be the point of contention was...continued to be the inclusion of the last sentence on line 27, or beginning on line 27, and I have submitted a proposal that I view as somewhat of a compromise in an attempt to try to clarify some of the language in that sentence. I don't know whether or not it is acceptable to the parties that are questioning this particular proposal and I don't believe...did that get printed in the Journal? I will just read that last sentence to you then and what I have prescribed to be the change. It would read...the last sentence would now read, if you were to adopt this amendment, it says, "An individual who primarily performs bargaining unit work and who is not determined to be a supervisor by definition for at least 75 percent of the employee's monthly work period, shall be included as a member of the bargaining unit." What I have attempted to do where we are dealing with substantial, if substantial supervisory activities is a point in question, is I have attempted to establish what substantial actually is without trying to do any damage to the specific definition that the NLRB definition has prescribed. And so I offer this as somewhat of a compromise and an amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator John DeCamp, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I would oppose the amendment of my very good friend, Senator Conway, and the reason is very simple. The objections I had to the original amendment or the original last sentence would even be compounded, compounded by this amendment. And I guess I find it
