So the line is drawn I think in a fair manner with this bill. I really don't think the opposition has been able to sway me in terms of the actual results of the legislation and I would like to ask your support for the advancement. Now I know many of you have concerns about the bill. We will keep looking at the different alternatives, but, frankly, the bill as in its form presently has been the one that has been worked on for two years. People have spent a lot of time on the issue. The attorneys have really tried to draft it in a way that will deal with the concerns that they have and I would ask your support for the advancement of the measure at this time.
