If they really meant safety even with this bill, though I don't like the idea, they would allow an officer to stop a person just for not having a safety belt because that is a violation of the law so what you are telling the officer is if he suspects a violation of the law, he cannot act as an officer because this is a political bill, not to uphold the majesty of the law, not to provide safety, but to bail the auto industry out.
