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PRESIDENT: Very well.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President...

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.) May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Haberman has proposed an amendment in Section 1, line 3, that after the word "belt" says "if a seat belt is provided." My amendment to the Haberman amendment says that it must be provided by the manufacturer. It is very important that safety belts are stressed for the impact under which they must operate. Therefore I am saying that the seat belt should be, when it is in place, be in place by the manufacturer. I would ask that this amendment be adopted to Senator Haberman's amendment, if you would, please.

PRESIDENT: How did you leave us, Senator Morehead?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I'm asking for adoption of my amendment to the Haberman amendment.

PRESIDENT: An amendment to the amendment has been offered by Senator Morehead. Now then, Senator Beutler, do you wish to speak on the amendment to the amendment, or not?

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland, Senator Nelson, we are on the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR NELSON: Senator Morehead took care of my question, so I will pass.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers. We are now discussing the Morehead amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I've got to ask Senator Haberman a question because I may have misunderstood, and if I did misunderstand, I may have misstated the purpose of his amendment. Senator Haberman, my understanding, and I stand to be corrected, was that your amendment was designed to
