It is legal to have four people there and this bill says you've got to do it or we're going to get you. That is wrong, that's absolutely wrong. Now as I said before, 80 percent of the people in my district don't like the bill anyway. But you do this and you're going to have an uprising. What is the State Patrol going to do? How are you going to enforce the law for those 411,000 people? You can't, you can't do it. Quite frankly, I don't think we should foster anything like this onto the general public of the State of Nebraska, so I ask you to support my amendment. If I have about three minutes left, would you like to have it, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Response inaudible.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Chambers said let's vote. As far as I'm concerned, please adopt the amendment and then we'll push onward. Thank you, Mr. President.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 1 nays to go under call.
