Well, all those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Machine vote has been requested. Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Could I have everybody punch in again and then I'd like to ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, no, we're all here.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: We're all here, okay, then I'd like a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, roll call vote has been asked. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 1378 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.
