SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, a call of the house has been requested. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The house is under call. All senators will return to the Chamber and please record their presence. Push your green buttons. Please record your presence. Senator Higgins, punch in, please. Please push your green buttons. Senator Hoagland. Okay, Senator Smith is here. I think that is everybody who is not excused. How many votes do we now need? Okay, at this point then it takes 23 votes in order to overrule the Chair. The motion is the overruling of the Chair. Senator Peterson, did you want a roll call vote? Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1388 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The motion fails. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Mr. President, then I would move to place LR 33 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee, the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, Senator Peterson, we consider that properly filed under: Rule 3, Section 17. The motion is certainly in order. Senator Peterson, did you wish to address it again before we go to the other lights?

SENATOR PETERSON: No, I will just wait to close. I will see what else will be said.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President and members, just to update you. This resolution was in the Constitution Committee. It was killed on a 4 to 2 vote. It does deal with the concept of going from a 90 to a 60 day session which means that we would be done shortly if we had that in effect right now. And if you will look up there on the board, you will see a
