

of them or several of them, you could be charged for that increase and I think...Senator Barrett, I hope this explains it a little bit but if we have to clarify the amendment, I think we can because it does leave a little bit to be desired. The intent was that it would not go against your experience rating if you were hit by an uninsured motorist that had no insurance to go against you because you were not at fault, even though your insurance company had to pay it. Does that clarify it a little bit? Senator Barrett. Okay, thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schmit, I understand you have a motion.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask for a division of the question and have the body vote on the first half of the amendment first if they would, please. I would like to move that we would put on Sections 1, 2, 3 and 5.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, as I understand your motion, Senator Schmit, and the question is divisible, the Chair will divide the question so that we will take up first, we will take up first items 1, 2, 3, 4...oh, I'm sorry, 1, 2, 3 and 5 of the committee amendments and then we will take up separately Section 4 of the amendments. So now the motion before the...the motion under debate will be the adoption of items 1, 2, 3, and 5 of the committee amendments. Those who would like to speak to that part of the committee amendments, now is the time. Senator Schmit, did you care to address the division of the question and the question before the house at this time?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I would just state briefly again that the portion which you are now voting on would be that portion which allows the motorist to secure a certificate of insurance as proof of insurability to provide to the county treasurer. And it would be...it would provide another avenue whereby they could provide proof. I would move that we would adopt that portion of the amendment. I would be glad to answer any questions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, Senators Chambers, Barrett, Higgins, and Conway, any of you that would like to address this portion of the committee amendments, would you raise your hands? Okay, Senator Higgins, you are first.
