SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the presentation. All those in favor of the resolution vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the Audubon resolution. All those wishing to vote, please do so. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 80.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. We'll move on to motions.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion from Senator DeCamp. Senator DeCamp would move to place LB 616 on General File notwithstanding the action of the Revenue Committee. That motion, Mr. President, was filed on March 29. It is found on page 1297 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel.) Ladies and gentlemen, could I please have your attention. We're very "visity" this morning which is nice, but we do need to hear the speakers. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President and members, this is the Olympic checkoff bill. It was killed in the committee. I've been waiting for additional research from the Attorney General. It hasn't arrived yet. I think the original opinion may have been based upon a thought that this is a private group or a private corporation. In fact, it's a federally chartered group. However, my opinion is that I don't have the votes here this morning, and since I don't believe in taking up legislative time unless there is a strong or very strong chance of success, I won't take it up. Wait till next year and see where we are and see if I can get additional research and then I won't waste the Legislature's time on something that probably doesn't stand a strong chance of success. How's that? What do you think? Let's just...it's the Olympic checkoff bill. Yeah, I'll pass over it then. We'll just give it up. Another year,
