SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, Rex, you'll see an old one and a new one. The old one, and I guess what I was remembering is the old one.

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR WESELY: See, if you had 286,000 a year, but then they miscalculated that in the department when they were figuring that up and so it's actually 151,000 so that difference is so significant that that's the reason it is taking longer.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Wesely, I don't think that it is quite proper for you to stand there and to quote a new fiscal note to me when I don't have it.

SENATOR WESELY: I think you do, Rex.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Is it in the book?

SENATOR WESELY: It's in your bill book. You'll see one 3/27/85, that's the new one and the old one is 2/13/85 so the new one came out after they miscalculated and we put the bill out on the floor and that's the reason instead of ten years it will take more like 20 evidently because what they thought would be the figures were wrong and so we have less money coming in than we realized.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you very much, Senator Wesely.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Labeledz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm not as concerned with the marriage certificate fee as I am with the birth certificate fee and I understand that Senator Chambers will have an amendment on that. I received a call the other day from a social service worker in Douglas County and he was most concerned about the fact that we were increasing the birth certificates from \$5.00 to \$8.00. I can recall it wasn't too long ago that a birth certificate was \$3.00. We increased it to \$5.00 and now going to \$8.00. I think that's a little high and what happens in every county as far as that is concerned, any single parent or low income family that has to apply for ADC
