

uses them. But I didn't hear all this talk a few years ago. So if and when in the next six years, that I'm in the Legislature, we have any more special fees come up, you may be rest assured that I'm going to call it to the attention of those senators about placing an undue burden on certain people. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, would you like to close, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'll be very brief, but a letter was shown to my by Senator Labeledz that she got from Vital Statistics in Douglas County and they pointed out that an increase of \$2.00 had been added to copies of birth certificates just in July of 1983, that the number of copies have been rising steadily up to that point, then the number being sought diminished. So it didn't result in an increase in revenue and they feel that by adding \$3.00 it could result in a net loss because of the fewer number of copies that people will seek. So there are reasons practical in addition to the ones of ethics that I am talking about, but remember this one thing. From time to time various amounts of money have gone from the general fund to put roofs on buildings and nothing in any intent language was as glowing about the need to repair roofs as we find in the intent language establishing this as a priority for the state. So as a step towards showing that we really think it is a priority, if enough of you are willing to support this bill, there are enough to make an appropriation for the program so I am asking that we take the first step by dealing with this marriage license extra fee that I call a hidden tax and strike the language at the bottom of page 10 and the top of page 11.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the closing on the Chambers' amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Chambers, there are four excused.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll ask for a call.
