SENATOR BEUTLER: The house is under call. All senators will return to the Chamber and record their presence, please. Push your green buttons, please. How many are excused, Mr. Clerk? Seven excused. Okay, everybody is here who is not excused, Senator Johnson. Do you wish a roll call vote?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Do we have everybody checked in who is not excused?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: All right, yes, a roll call vote, please.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1424-25 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The amendment fails. Are there any further amendments on the desk, Mr. Clerk,?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
