

excused. Do you wish to proceed with the roll call vote?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes. Let's see, Senator Schmit is excused and Senator Chizek is excused. Senator Schmit will be here in 30 seconds. Senator Nichol is with the Governor. I would like to have Senator Nichol brought back.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, Mr. Sergeant-at-Arms, would you retrieve Senator Nichol, please. We are waiting on Senator Nichol, for any of you who have lost track. We understand Senator Nichol is on his way. Senator Johnson, do you wish to proceed at this point?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: If Senator Nichol is on his way, I see no reason why the roll could not be called slowly.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I want it to be clear, Senator Johnson, that you are not relying upon my representation. Do you wish to call the roll at this time?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I have never relied on your representation. Call the roll, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1435-36 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The committee amendments are not adopted. We are back on the main bill. Do you have further motions, Mr. Clerk? Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have other motions, however, Senator DeCamp has filed a priority motion to bracket the bill until January 1985.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The call is raised. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, very simple arguments. Number one, we have no idea whether we are going to get this money at all and yet we have got 49 people here pretty eerily spending it, just spending it as if we had it. And we are spending it on programs that, noble as they are, apparently don't have enough strength to get that money out of the general fund, out of the normal process. And if you
