This is a compromise amendment brought in from the trial attorneys that we are offering and I am sorry if I led you to believe it was a compromise by both parties. A simple amendment, does three things, I think all of which are acceptable to the opposing parties except that it doesn't go in any way close to what they want from the bill. In fact, they would, of course, like not to have the bill at all. They would like to keep the law in current form. But I think both sides would agree that these would be some kind of concessions given up from one side to the other. And I understand it is getting late and I am sure we are going to debate this more so I will just close or offer the amendment to you and urge its adoption. And if Senator DeCamp wants to finish my closing time...he says not, I move the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the closing. All those in favor of the Hannibal amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Tomorrow we will be meeting at nine o'clock, of course, starting with Final Reading. The final bill on Final Reading is LB 662 which I understand will have some attempted amendments. So thank you for working very hard today and we will expect to do the same thing tomorrow. Senator Smith, you haven't said much today, would you like to say something about adjourning until tomorrow at nine o'clock, please.

SENATOR SMITH: I would be happy to. Mr. President, I move that we adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock, April 10th, Wednesday.
