

what this amendment does, the bill as it presently stands would eliminate the current 1 percent of collections of aviation fuel tax that goes to the general fund and I assume historically that was done to pay for the collection. What the amendment does would defer that effective date of the 1 percent by one year and the reason that I am suggesting it is that there is about a twelve, thirteen thousand dollar reduction in general fund receipts and there is a proposed cost of thirteen to fifteen thousand for new forms which would have the effect of being in the vicinity of a \$27,000 impact on the general fund. If the amendment is adopted, then in effect the general fund will be reimbursed as it is now by that 1 percent which in effect pays for the new forms that are required. After a one year period, it is my understanding that the actual cost for collections are so minuscule that it really isn't necessary for an A bill, probably two, three hundred dollars, but by doing this, at least we can avoid a \$27,000 impact on the general fund this year and I don't think it creates any problem. So I move the bill be returned for the specific amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, Senator Warner did speak to me about this amendment a few minutes ago and he represented the amendment just exactly as he represented it right this moment. To be truthful with you, I don't have any misgivings about it or see any problems with it and I have no question about it being adopted so I would go ahead and return the bill for this specific amendment and then return the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to close? The question is the returning of LB 272 to Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.
