Senator Higgins, let's go. Senator Haberman. Senator Landis, you are the next speaker, please. Thank you, ladies and gentlemen.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I don't intend to wait until 1989. I intend to vote this year for some money in LB 505. I want to get to it. As a matter of fact, if I raise some money this year and maybe next year as well and I get down to say 42 percent, what is going to happen when I have to raise two cents in 1989? No, I don't want to wait that long. I want to get to the matter now at hand of transferring sales and income tax dollars for property relief when I know that I am going to be putting it onto a system that is fairly operated. I am going to do that this year. And I certainly don't want to be in a situation of having a law if I make a deposit on my goal this year and maybe one next year and I have raised some property relief money through state aid to get hit in 1989 to raise taxes two more cents. It just doesn't make in that sense good sense to me to do that now. Besides, let's bite off things as they come up and as we decide to undertake the obligation of property tax relief.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me.

SENATOR LANDIS: I am going to do it this year.
