SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, you have heard the resolution just read before you. Millard Public Schools and the town of Millard, if it were still a corporate city...incorporated town, will be celebrating their centennial this year and the City of Millard has been annexed into the City of Omaha. However, the Millard school district is still autonomous and intact. They are celebrating their centennial this year and Don Stroh has been the Superintendent of those schools for many years. I might mention that the lady...the teacher involved in the resolution has been a teacher for 49 years and they are going to be inducted into the Hall of Fame this Sunday and we would like to send them our congratulations in the form of a resolution. The four Senators that are on the resolution, the three besides myself all have parts of our district that sit in the Millard school district and I would urge your adoption of the resolution.
