PRESIDENT: Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I would call the question.

PRESIDENT: All right, thank you. I may not need it. Is there anyone else here to speak other than Senator Haberman on this measure? I am going to recognize Senator Haberman to close, and thank you for the motion, Senator Lundy.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I will be real brief because I want to give some of my time to Senator Warner...or Senator Schmit. Senator Warner said, contrary to every principle to force an individual opposed to an issue is absolutely wrong. Senator Barrett said he couldn't understand why producers are forced by law to support an issue they disagree with. Well, they are both way out in left field because there are many, many, many producers that do not believe in the checkoff that are forced by laws we passed to pay the checkoff. So if you feel this way, gentlemen, then you should support legislation to make everything voluntary. I wonder how you would vote on that. Then Senator Warner says, private and government is something different. Well, what about the REAs? That is public and they have one of the biggest packs and they do support legislatures politically. So Senator Warner is wrong on that issue. So to help agriculture I can't understand why they are fighting because that is where the action is, is you have got to go to Washington to do it and they have got to have money. And it won't be on political campaigns, it will be on issues to help agriculture. Therefore, I will give the rest of my time to Senator Schmit.
