

one vote for doing it. We have said that you can stay in your local high school that you are going to. You don't have to change schools, if you are already going there, and we didn't pick up any votes for doing that. We said we are going to set the implementation date off until 1986 and nobody voted for it additionally for doing that. This amendment itself says it doesn't take effect until July 31st, 1986. We could pass this bill next year and it would come into effect at the same point in time. I guess I would like to ask Senator Scofield a question, if she would yield, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Would you respond, please?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Certainly.

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator Scofield, if we adopt this amendment, if all the proponents decide that this is a wonderful idea and vote for the amendment and satisfy your concerns about those poor rancher's children out there that suddenly can't find themselves a way to go to school, will you then become a proponent and vote for LB 662?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: You know I won't, Senator Vickers, and in fact...

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you very much. I suggest to you that it might not be only the proponents that are not looking for compromises. Now I understand that. I have been on opposite sides of pieces of legislation in here in the past as well, but let's not kid ourselves, let's not kid ourselves as to what is going on, and let's not kid ourselves that we are passing legislation with this amendment that is needed, that is needed this year, that is needed so quickly that we cannot wait for the study resolution that we are creating, the study committee that we are creating, that is needed so quickly that we could not have a bill introduced exactly like this next year and get it passed before this goes into effect.
