

Congressional Districts, allows every member of this body an opportunity to serve on the study committee including Senator Lamb or Senator Scofield or both and that allowance will be satisfied by the wishes of the Executive Board. I like the original draft. I think that is the one that ought to be maintained. At this time I would oppose Senator Lamb's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, I, too, oppose the Lamb amendment and one of the reasons that I do is because I was looking forward to dragging Senator Scofield around over the sandhills this summer and she is not on the Education Committee or the Revenue Committee. So I think that it is appropriate that we leave the mechanism that is in place and I will assure Senator Lamb that I will do what I can to work with the Executive Committee to get both you and Senator Scofield on the study committee because I think it is appropriate that both proponents and opponents are represented on that particular committee and both of you have shown a considerable interest in this piece of legislation. The end result is that it probably isn't going to make all that much difference but if it is a fear of not having certain people on, particularly yourself, Senator Lamb, I don't think you need to fear that at all, and as I indicated, I think Senator Scofield ought to be part of the study. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Scofield, please.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Mr. Speaker, very briefly, all I have got to say with friends like Tom Vickers, I have a feeling I may end up on this committee whether I want to be on it or not. I don't really have any preference about the way we do this. I just want to see the state represented and I will be happy to see Senator Lamb on there but I don't really feel any burning desire to change it. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, would you like to close please.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, yes, I guess I have a problem here because I would like to see...I would like to see a bigger committee. Senator Scofield and I are both from the Third Congressional District. It doesn't seem logical to me that
