attention, please return to your seats. We are going to do Final Reading. As soon as you have returned to your seats, we will do 569. Now I will include ladies and gentlemen. (Gavel.) Ladies and gentlemen, please return to your seats so we can begin. Thank you. Begin, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, right before that, Senator Wesely had amendments I understand he wishes to withdraw to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: So ordered.

CLERK: (Read LB 569 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 1505 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 1 present and not voting, 8 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 569 passes. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 83, LB 384, LB 441, LB 559, LB 349, LB 341, LB 255, LB 215 and LB 569. Okay, we will move on to priority bills, General File. LB 157, the introducer is gone. LB 432, the introducer is gone. So we jump clear down to 408. Senator Hefner, are you prepared?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 408 was a bill offered by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 18 of this year. It was referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments, Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I will explain the committee amendments to the body. The committee amendments strike the original sections of the bill and so the committee amendments will be the bill. And we have incorporated two other bills with this LB 408. That is LB 238 and LB 266. The amendment broadens the section to ensure that other nonprofit organizations can use bingo,
