SENATOR WITHEM: In response to Senator Beutler's question, we are not adding with this bill public parks, playgrounds and recreational facilities. Those were powers enumerated to SIDs that are in existing statute. All we are saying is that those that are enumerated, the SID may contract with another subdivision of government to perform those particular functions. With that, yes, I think we are late in the day. SIDs are a complex subject. This is my closing. I would urge you to advance this bill and then Senator Beutler and others who may have questions about the SID process in general, I would be happy to visit with them as we continue on the process.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to advance 207, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Do you have something to put in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Hoagland would like to print amendments to 612; Senator Landis amendments to 413 and 157. (See pages 1508-10 of the Legislative Journal.) And Senator Pappas to 284, Mr. President. (See pages 1510-11 of the Legislative Journal.)

That is all that I have.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Lundy, would you still have a voice and can you say some good words to us? But before you do, I would like to thank you all very much for your cooperation during the difficult past two days when I realized you were under...you were sequestered and held down in your seats while we were on Final Reading and I know a few of you became irritated but generally you have been good sports and I really appreciate it. It is a difficult bill and perhaps maybe the most important one we will handle this year, but I really do appreciate your cooperation. Senator Lundy.
