

CLERK: (Bill read on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall 132 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk. Have you all voted? Now record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1518-19 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 132 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 132A.

CLERK: (Bill read on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1519-20 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 132A passes. LB 346 with the emergency clause attached.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Chambers would move to return 346 to Select File for specific amendment. Senator Chambers's amendment is on page 1497 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this is truly a friendly amendment. I've talked to Senator Schmit and others who have an interest in the bill. All it does is require the labeling of fuel dispensing pumps to indicate whether they have ethanol, methanol or a combination of those substances, or any other type of mixture, and it makes violation an infraction, which is the mildest type of punishment you can have because the end is not to punish but to get the labeling. In order that
